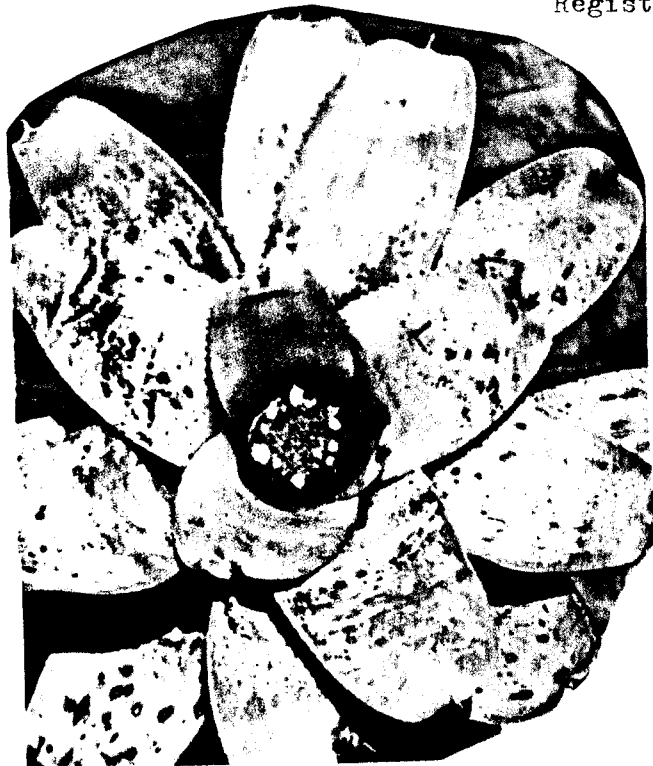

- angustifolia - Light green with darker marks - blue berries, branched spike. \$3.00
- araneosa - Upright, green rosette. Many branched spike, dusted with white... \$5.00
- 'Bert' - Green & purplish bands on upright vase. Cold sensitive. Good drainage \$5.00
- bracteata - Stiff, bottle shape. Arching spike. Needs protection from cold.. \$3.00
- bromeliifolia - Grey-green, bottle shape. White cone shaped flower head..... \$1.50
- caesea - (may be hybrid) Upright rosette. Pretty pink & blue flower head.... \$2.50

Light to full sun in protected place. They divide into two groups. Those that offset by stolons and types that split into divisions and have to be cut into sections and rerooted before sale.

Bromeliads range from sun-loving plants for the open garden, through half-hard for sheltered, well drained positions - under tall shrubs, trees, or in bush-house shelters, to types for glass-house culture. Those from hot, humid areas need extra heat in winter.

Availability, not their beauty, set their price and plants that produce few offsets, are more costly than those that sucker freely.

Our Bromeliad Specials are selected from hardy, contrasting types and will be named, rooted offsets. Tell us where you wish to grow your plants, so that suitable types can be selected. Also advise which bromeliads you already have, or describe them, if names unknown and we will not duplicate.

BROMELIAD SPECIALS: (Packing & postage extra). A colourful selection to start an interesting collection.....\$20.00 \$30.00 or \$40.00

PARCELS: You are notified by letter of parcel despatch and a charge of \$1.00 is added for letter, packing moss, plant dip etc.

Arrival of packed plants. Remove the plastic holding moss around the roots. If time permits, remove the moss and pot at once, if not, place plant and moss in an empty pot with plant label and water lightly. Remove moss when placing plant in compost.

Potting. Use the smallest pot that will accommodate the roots. As the roots fill pot, then pot on, giving the plant a boost with fresh compost.

Potting Mix. Cymbidium orchid mix is suitable for most bromeliads. Additives such as gritty sand, charcoal, etc. will be given with the cultural instructions on each plant ticket.

This Price List will be given in three parts. Small, Middle Size & Large Size.

The small bromeliads, while very good when grown in pots (the exceptions are the silvery tillandsias. These need to be mounted on cork or such), also make hanging basket (or hanging pot) specimens. Those offsetting on stolons (woody stems) can be attached to driftwood or mounted on a "Brom Tree". This can be made by placing a tree shaped branch in concrete, or by wedging it into an attractive base with rocks. Decorate your host tree with small bromeliads, using strips of panty hose to tie the plants in place. The roots can be padded with a little moss or coconut fibre. The new roots will cling to the tree and need no extra padding. Tillandsia usneoides (Spanish Moss) can be draped here and there on the tree for final effect.

X 'Hoescheriana' (chlorosticta X nutans) - pointed tubes, splashed pink and white. Inflorescence pendent. Hardy.....\$1.50

leitzii - thinner tubes than leptopoda. Wavy edged leaves, splashed cream.

Flowers bright cerise and yellow. Winter care.....\$2.00

leptopoda - Small spotted tubes with leaf-tip curl. Erect spike with orange bracts and blue tipped petals. Flowers mid-winter. Hardy.....\$1.50

nutans - ("Queens Tears") Hardy clumping species. Nodding spike of blue, green and rose pink. 3 offsets for\$2.00

X 'Santa Barbara'-variegated with cream border. Pointed leaves are wider than nutans. Pinks in bright light. Hardy.....\$2.50

X 'T.L. Mead' - a little larger but included here as it likes to hang in a pot or basket. Large, pendent spike at odd intervals. Hardy.....\$1.50

X 'Violet Beauty' - Also a little larger, but hardy like the above. Pendent...\$1.50

Lovely open red vase. Lilac-pink petals.....\$3.50

X 'Windii' - narrow, upright tubes, pendent red and blue spikes.Hardy.....\$1.50

X 'Perrians Pride' - perhaps a distachia hybrid. Short, upright tube,

- CRYPTANTHUS: 'The Earth Stars', being terrestrial, need a little peat moss and charcoal added to cymbidium orchid type mix and bright shade.
- acaulis var. ruber - small, bronze-red star. Leaves undulating & recurved. Hardy \$1.
 - " variegated - variegated form and a little larger than the species.....\$3.
 - bahianus - hardy in full sun. Upright stems with stiff, pointed leaves.....\$1.
 - " hybrid - similar to bahianus, but not as stiff.....\$1.
 - beuckeri - mottled, spoon shaped leaves. Very tricky in winter, as leaves must be kept dry in cold weather.....\$2.
 - bivittatus - pink and silver-grey stripes. Deep pink in bright light. Hardy.....\$1.
 - " 'Ruby' - Lovely ruby-red form of the above.....\$5.
 - bromelioides var. tricolor - more upright rosette of green and white, flushed pink in good light. Needs winter care.....\$3.

 - 'Cascade' - reddish rosettes with new plantlets cascading on long stolons. For hanging baskets. Need winter care.....\$3.
 - Small Form - Half the size of the above, but more hardy.....\$3.
 - 'Costers Favorite' - variegated with deep pink border. A recent import.....\$10.
 - diversifolius - medium-large star. Green to red-brown, dusted with silver.....\$1.
 - fosterianus - Lovely, large, red-brown, cross banded with silver.....\$3.
 - cross banded with gold.....\$3.
 - " 'Elaine' - as above but edged with pink.....\$10.
 - 'Glad' - wide green to golden pink leaves form an attractive rosette..... \$2.
 - 'Green Ice' - wide green leaves with some frosting. Can pink in good light..... \$2.
 - 'It' - large green and white variegated that pinks in good light..... \$3.
 - 'It' - the reverse form of 'It' and called 'Ti'. Equally lovely \$5.
 - lacerdae - silver and green striped star. Demand exceeds supply..... \$3.
 - 'Osyanus' - mottled leaves wider than 'Lubbersianus'. Flushed pink in good light \$2.
 - maritimus - upright tufts. Reddish in good light. Hardy.....\$1.
 - 'Peppered Bronze' - narrow bronze leaves with some frosting. Hardy.....\$1.
 - 'Racinae' - (or is it Feuerzauber ?) crossbanded brown and silver. Hardy.....\$3.
 - 'Rosa McLeod' - green to brownish leaves that flush rose in centre.....\$2.
 - 'Ripple Fudge' - medium large with brownish leaves frosted white.....\$2.
 - 'Silver Sheen' - green to pinkish leaves heavily frosted with silver.....\$3.

 'Oeser's Small Red' - small, neat rosette for hanging pot or basket.....\$3.
